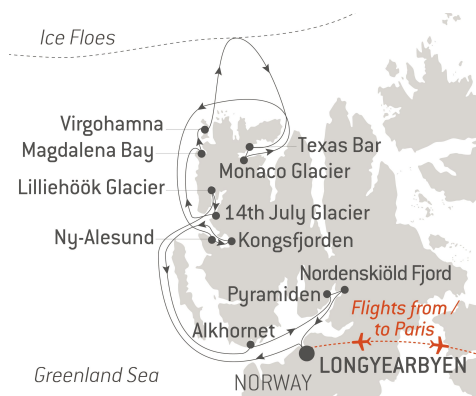

This journey will take you on the trail of **walruses**, which can be admired near the **14th July Glacier**, as well as the traces of the **polar bear**, the lord of the Arctic, which you will be able to admire in its natural environment.

Then you will sail to the **Svalbard archipelago**, and the last islands before the North Pole, where you will discover that unique feeling of having reached the top of the world. During this unforgettable expedition, our ship will sail to latitudes of **80° north**.

We are privileged guests in these remote lands where we are at the mercy of weather, ice, tidal and current conditions. Landings on certain sites and the observation of certain wildlife cannot be guaranteed. They vary from day to day, making each PONANT cruise a unique experience.
